

٢٣٤. وَقَالَ (عَلَيْهِ السَّلَامُ): خَيْرُ خِصَالِ النِّسَاءِ شَرُّهُنَّ خِصَالِ الرِّجَالِ: الزَّهْوُ وَالْجُبْنُ وَالْبَخْلُ، فَإِذَا كَانَتِ الْمَرْأَةُ مَزْهُوَّةً لَمْ تُمْكِنَ مِنْ نَفْسِهَا، وَإِذَا كَانَتْ بَخِيلَةً حَفِظَتْ مَالَهَا وَمَالَ بَعْلِهَا، وَإِذَا كَانَتْ جَبَانَةً فَرِقَتْ مِنْ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ يَعْزِضُ لَهَا.
