اللَّهُمَّ صِنِّ وَجْهِي بِالْيَسَارِ، وَلَا تَبْدُلْ جَاهِي بِالْاِقْتَارِ، فَأَسْتَرْزِقَ طَالِبِي رِزْقِكَ، وَأَسْتَعْتِفَ شِرَارِ خَلْقِكَ، وَأُبْتَلَى بِحَمْدٍ مَنْ أَعْطَانِي، وَأَفْتَنَ بِنَمٍّ مَنْ مَنَعَنِي، وَأَنْتَ مِنْ وَرَاءِ ذَلِكَ كُلِّهِ وَلِيُّ الْأَعْطَاءِ وَالْمَنْعِ، ﴿إِنَّكَ عَلَىٰ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ قَدِيرٌ﴾
